RESPONSIBILITY to the LODGE

Every member has a duty and responsibility to the Lodge to which he belongs. So many receive the three degrees and then forget all about the Lodge. They seem to feel that it's somebody else's responsibility to keep the Lodge going. For a Brother to forget the Lodge that gave him his Masonic birth is like a son who would forget his mother that gave him physical birth. Suppose no one attended Lodge meetings any more than you do, nor took any more of an active part than you do, nor showed any more interest than you do, what would have happened to your Lodge? Would it still be in existence?

RESPONSIBILITY AS A SPONSOR (Top Line Signer)

All too often a newly made Mason, usually at the Entered Apprentice and Fellow Craft stages in his Masonic career, drops out and eventually demits or receives a non-payment of dues suspension. Is it his fault??? No, it is yours!!! You, as his sponsor and mentor, began ignoring him the minute the ink from your signature had dried on his petition for initiation. You were not there for his initiation, passing or raising. You failed to assist him with his memory work. You failed to phone him on a regular basis or visit him, to ensure he is not having any difficulties with his memory work. You failed to invite him and his wife out to a lady's night, to ensure his wife felt part of the Masonic community. He probably does not know the protocol for these types of social functions as of yet and never assume he does. Basically, you left him standing alone, thus leaving him with the feeling he is not part of the Masonic fraternity, subsequently losing interest in his lodge and never returning.

This, my brethren, is OUR fault, not the members who lose interest. They lose interest because they are not stimulated in lodge, their sponsors forget their obligations and most of all, they are being ignored/disregarded amongst the lodge members who should be taking these new members under their wing and making him feel welcomed and part of the circle.

It is your duty as a sponsor/mentor to ensure, once you petition someone, that you strive to stay with him throughout the entire process. You should be ensuring that the new member is cared for, support and directed throughout the process. Remember! If you are going to sponsor someone, be there for him after the ink on his petition dries, from start to finish. I realize that many of us, due to family and work commitments, cannot be there all of the time. But there is always that second person who affixed his signature on that petition and has the same obligation as you do.

LODGE ROOM BEHAVIOR

Lodge at Refreshment

- a. Masonic term meaning "recess".
- b. Permissible to leave the Lodge room.
- c. Craft is under the direction of the Junior Warden.

Lodge at Labor

- 1. No one should pass between Master and Altar.
 - a. A Master relies on the Great Light (Holy Bible) to rule and govern his Lodge. Line of vision should never be broken.
 - b. *Exception during Degree work, officers may pass this way in a clockwise motion while conducting candidate.
- 2. Lodge at Labor
 - a. No audible conversation or noise that will distract the attention of the candidate or interrupt the business of the Lodge.
 - b. No one may leave the Lodge room without the permission of the Worshipful Master.
- 3. Lodge at Refreshment
 - a. Same as Lodge at Labor except that the Brethren may converse quietly.
 - b. No one should move about or leave Lodge room without permission of the Worshipful Master.

ENTERING LODGE AFTER THE MEETING HAS BEGUN:

If a brother should enter the lodge after the opening ceremony is under way, he should go to the Altar to salute the Master. If he must leave before the meetings over, the correct Masonic etiquette of his departure is that he should salute the Presiding Master at the Altar before he departs.

The salute should always be given properly and not in a careless or perfunctory manner.
