LATE ADMISSION TO THE LODGE

Masonic etiquette, for the most part, is merely good manners and respect for your lodge, its members, Its Worshipful Master and the convention of Freemasonry, in general.

If he must leave before the meeting is over, the correct Masonic etiquette of his departure is that he should salute the Presiding Master at the Altar before he departs.

The salute should always be given properly and not in a careless or perfunctory manner.

The Master of each lodge has the right and authority to admit Brethren to his lodge. Consequently each Lodge Master makes his own decision as to how he wishes to handle those who arrive late. There are two options:

- (1) strict compliance with Masonic etiquette and tradition, or
- (2) adapt to modern times with emphasis on maintaining order during the meeting.

OPTION NO. 1, Masonic etiquette, involves disruption to the normal course of business/degree or delaying the Brother's entry until the lodge is at either refreshment or free from restraint.

OPTION NO. 2 allows Masonic etiquette for the admission of first time, un-

vouched for, Brethren and a more relaxed procedure for the admission of other Brethren. Consequently, the Lodge Master needs to make his own decision and the following is provided as a guideline should the Master wish to use a more relaxed process to admit late visitors.

All Brethren are encouraged and expected to arrive early enough to be present during the opening of any Lodge meeting. To arrive late to our meetings or degree conferrals is disrespectful, disruptive and disregards basic business and Masonic etiquette.
