#### From the South -

Greetings Brethren...I hope everyone is safe and surviving the last week and a half as this is written. The Palisades and Eaton (Altadena) fires have been devastating! And, that word does not come close to describing it. Which is what 'From the South' is about this month...It is 'Relief' and helping others in time of need. On Sunday, Jan. 12th I had the pleasure of attending Destiny Lodge's Installation. For those who don't know, Destiny Lodge is located on the campus of the Masonic Homes of Covina and has been chartered for approximately 10 years. The Master to be installed was (now Wor.) John Pomroy, who some of you might remember was on the event committee for our Murder Mystery Dinner a couple of years ago. He is also the Director of the Children's Advocacy Center at the Masonic Homes campus. The installation was something beautiful to behold...it was a 'textbook' installation, from floorwork, the first time Master of Ceremonies... everything. It was a wonderful Sunday afternoon. Two days later, John and his wife Kathy's home in Altadena burned to the ground. From a jubilant occasion to devastation. Evacuated with essentially some important papers and the clothes they had on. Last week, a Brother requested some financial assistance from our Lodge Charity Committee. While we agreed to help him, the amount of financial support we as a Lodge could offer, was as far as I am concerned... embarrassing. Why? Because we simply do not have the funds. Nor do we have the funds to help any of our Widows, or Brothers should they need financial help.

Which brings me to the heart of this month's article. As Masons we are taught early on in our journey, to provide assistance to those in need, to support one another in both good times and not so good times. So, where does or would the money come from to help a distressed Brother? As far-fetched as it seems, it comes from the proceeds of our events...like the Murder Mystery Dinner (planned for 150; 62 attended), Festive Lodge and Table Lodge events, pancake breakfasts, steak frys to name a few. It goes back to the dilemma that's been talked about for more than a couple of years...the Officers have (when they've been able) put together, shopped, organized, cooked, etc. for them. And, despite those best efforts, our members seemingly have no interest in attending.

I guess my larger question is: 'What can we do better, What would you like to see, What events or other activities would be of interest to you, to come back?' To re-engage with YOUR

I'll close with this...some time years ago, I was one of the young guys...and the older guys in the Lodge held those fundraisers. There were planning committees for them. Members, by being part of these Committees got to know others Brothers who they may not have known that well, and bonds of friendship and camaraderie were formed. Now, I'm one of the 'older guys'... However, I remember the well-attended Lodge events...Steak Fry's where we netted 3, 5, 6,000 dollars. I remember when we were able to purchase a couple of defibrillators (which were relatively new and expensive) and donated them to the Glendora Police Department. A positive impact on our community...and maybe...just maybe, one of them was used to help save someone's life.

What would it take for you to return to Lodge and be a part of not only helping it, but also help return us to a position where we could provide meaningful assistance to a Brother, or even someone or a group in our Community? 


