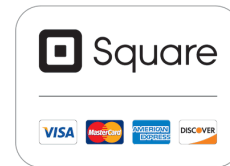

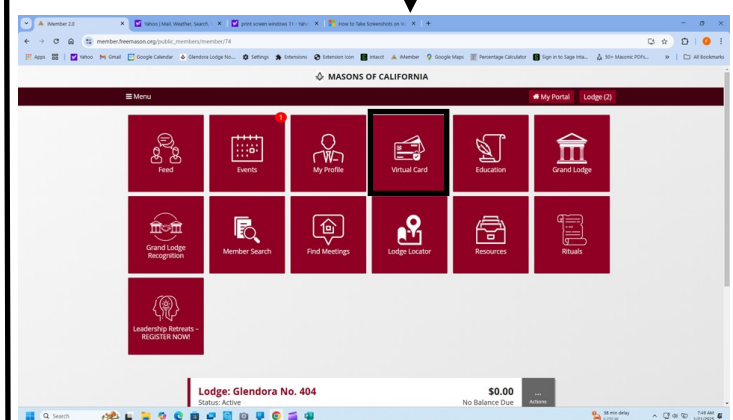

Greetings Brethren...
